Zapit Records First Career Win in the Oklahoma Classics Lassie at 94/1 Odds

What a way to break a maiden! Not only did Zapit (Itsmyluckyday – Zuni Women, by Bob and John) get her first win in her second career start, she did so in a \$100,000 black type stakes race... all while returning \$190.40 on a \$2 to win bet! After running a mediocre fourth in her only previous start two weeks prior, the bay filly didn't let the betting public's lack of faith in her stop her from cruising home to a decisive 4 ½ length victory at Remington Park on October 16th. She stopped the clock at 1:12.18 in the six-furlong contest for two-year-old fillies. Zapit was bred in Oklahoma by Tim Harris' Circle Bar H. She is a homebred for Tim and races under his Big Sugar Racing banner. Her dam, Zuni Women, resided at Endeavor Farm during the breeding season of 2016 when she was bred to Itsmyluckyday. We couldn't be happier for Tim, who has boarded mares here seasonally for many years as part of his regional breeding program. Nobody deserves this victory more than he!
