Switch to Turf Works Wonders for Pranked, Wins Easily by 4 ½ Lengths



Sometimes when a racehorse tries something new for the first time, be it a surface, distance, or racetrack, a light can just come on. In the case with Pranked, all three of those variables were firsts and she

responded to the alterations with a dominating performance! After making her first three career starts in dirt sprints at Churchill Downs and Indiana Grand, the bay daughter of Into Mischief tried her hand at a two-turn contest on the turf course at Fair Grounds on December 15th. She broke from the gate beautifully to take an early lead and steadily distanced herself from the field throughout the race to notch a gate-to-wire victory by a margin of 4 ½ lengths. Pranked was bred by Endeavor Farm and is the second foal out of the Hard Spun mare Tightly Wound. She is owned by Nicole Lyvere and we could not be happier for her getting the first of hopefully many victories with this horse! Trainer Tom Amoss deserves lots of credit for having this filly rearing and ready to go. Great ride by jockey James Graham. Here's to continuing great form in the New Year, cheers!

The bay filly by Power Broker was content to sit a few lengths off the pace for most of the race, having to swing out wide in deep stretch to find some room. And find some room she did, blowing past her rivals and sailing clear to a 1 ¾ length margin of victory. Kittyhawk Lass has earned over \$62,000 in her nine career starts.
