Benchmark Babe Breaks Maiden By Seven Lengths



Benchmark Babe (Tapizar – Turtle Creek Babe, by Grand Slam) ran away with one when she broke her maiden at Indiana Grand on September 8th, sweeping past the leaders in the lane to pull off and win by an impressive seven length margin. She paid \$15.00 for winning the mile and a sixteenth turf race. It was career start number four for the homebred belonging to Barnett Stables. The bay filly was foaled and raised here at Endeavor Farm, and is pictured above as a foal when she was still by her dam's side just over three years ago. Turtle Creek Babe is now the dam of four foals of racing age with three winners. A big congratulations to the Barnetts, who are longtime clients of the farm.
