Isotope Picks Up Black Type Victory with a Win in the Thirty Eight Go Go Stakes at Laurel Park

Isotope (Successful Appeal – Anabanch, by Congaree) has been on quite the tear since moving to Laurel Park in September! The just turned five-year-old mare has made four starts so far in Maryland, which have included three wins and one second, with the most recent win coming on December 29th in the \$100,000 Thirty Eight Go Go Stakes. Facing a field of 10, Isotope jumped out of the gate from post one and settled well just off the pace, saving ground on the rail the whole way around. The instructions from trainer Jeramiah Englehart to jockey Jorge Vargas, Jr. were to get Isotope to the outside of the pack, but traffic would not allow him to do so. Therefore, he did the next best thing and just stayed on the rail to save ground and took command of the lead in mid-stretch, never looking back to win the race by a 1 ¾ length margin.



The bay mare picked up \$60,000 for the win which brings her lifetime career earnings up to \$240,515. Isotope was foaled and raised here at Endeavor Farm and was bred by longtime friends and clients of the farm, Jim & Mary Durlacher. She is the first foal out of farm resident Anabanch. Isotope's younger full brother Roiland, who just turned three, has gotten his racing career off to a very promising start with two wins and a second from four starts. He is nominated to the Grade III Lecomte Stakes at Fair Grounds on January 19th, which is the first in the series of Kentucky Derby prep races held in New Orleans. Anabanch's two-year-old colt by Summer Front sold in the Fasig-Tipton July Select Yearling Sale last summer for \$50,000 and is nominated to The Gulfstream Sale of selected two-year-olds in training in March. His younger half-sister is a Can the Man yearling filly who will be sold at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed sale in February. Anabanch is currently in foal to Klimt and due to deliver in April of this year. There's a lot going for this promising young family and a stakes win by the oldest of the bunch is certainly an accomplishment to be proud of! A huge congratulations to all of the connections involved, especially to Jim & Mary Durlacher who so much deserve this success. Can't wait to see what 2019 brings for this mare and her family!

Archidust Breaks Maiden at Gulfstream



An impressive maiden special weight victory was just what the doctor ordered for Archidust (Verrazano – Chilling Effect, by Gold Fever) to close out the season. After running third in his debut at Monmouth in September, the just turned three-year-old colt won for fun in only his second career start at Gulfstream Park on December 2. A huge congratulations to Dr. Bart Barber's Wolverton Mountain Farm who bred this talented young colt. Archidust was foaled here at Endeavor Farm and we look forward to following his 2019 campaign.
