He and longtime friend Sally Feola (and co-owner) took a special liking to this feisty little horse and they decided to keep her and named her Magic Lea. She was the type of horse who loved being at the racetrack, loved being ridden, and loved everything about racing. Magic Lea was always chomping at the bit to run and she always gave it her all, no matter the circumstances. Her and Sally even helped each other rehab through injuries! When her racing career was finished, Mark decided to send Magic Lea to Wafare Farm (which eventually became Endeavor Farm) to be bred to the stallion Prospector's Gamble. This breeding is how Mark and Terry met, and as they say, the rest is history. A strong friendship and partnership formed between Mark and Terry, which eventually led to the creation of Endeavor Farm. All because of Magic Lea! She lived out the rest of her days here on the farm, first as a broodmare and later as a retiree. Magic Lea was euthanized on September 21st due to complications of old age. She was 23. Magic Lea was cremated and will be buried on the farm.



Roiland a Winner in Debut Race at Indiana Grand

One start, one win! No better way to begin a racing career than with an impressive victory, and that's exactly what Roiland (Successful Appeal – Anabranch, by Congaree) did in his debut in maiden special weight company at Indiana Grand. Off at odds of 9/2, the bay colt stalked the pace from the outside for most of the race until finding room at the eighth pole to win a stretch duel and pull away to a ¾ length victory. Roiland picked up \$18,600 for the score. It was a special win with owners/breeders Jim and Mary Durlacher in attendance to see their homebred bring home the victory. Congratulations on a very fun race with a very talented young colt! Roiland's 4-year-old full-sister, Isotope, just won an allowance race in September to bring her total career earnings to over \$144,000, and his yearling half-brother by Summer Front sold in July for \$50,000.
