We were ecstatic to get a final bid of \$50,000 for the Summer Front – Anabranth colt at the Fasig-Tipton July Select Yearling Sale. He was bred by CJ Thoroughbreds and Endeavor Farm. He should have every chance to go on and do well as he was purchased by Justin Casse. Can't wait to see him on the track!



## Out of Trouble Wins at Saratoga by 14 ½ Lengths

Talk about winning by daylight! Former Endeavor Farm resident Out of Trouble (Into Mischief – Take Me Home Too, by Came Home) won like a good thing in allowance company at Saratoga on July 27<sup>th</sup> when she crushed the field by a whopping 14 ½ lengths. This was Out of Trouble's third start back this summer after a seven month layoff. She had run second in both of her previous two starts in allowance races at Belmont. The bay filly seems to really be finding her form in her four-year-old campaign as she is at the top of her game for trainer Brad Cox. She has now earned over \$180,000. Out of Trouble was foaled in New York but came to Endeavor right after foaling and resided here until being sales prepped and sent to the Fasig-Tipton October Yearling sale where she sold for \$75,000. She is her dam's second foal; the first foal is stakes winner Bird of Trey (by Birdstone). Congratulations to J.R. and Rita Young for breeding this talented filly!
