#### Highestdisctinction Back in Top Form for Willow Lane Stable with Sharp Allowance Victory at Delaware Park



Horses, just like any other type of athlete, can really benefit from time off. It gives them a chance not just to heal up from the physical demands of being a racehorse, but it's also an opportunity to clear their mind and act like a horse again. After a 12-month period that resulted in some good, but not great starts, it seemed like Highestdistinction needed some time away from the track to hit the reset button. And that's exactly what owner Willow Lane Stable (John Kuehl) decided to do with him. The bay son of Point of Entry came back to the farm last August for some rest and relaxation. He spent a little over three months here and went back into training just

after Thanksgiving. It was apparent from the get go that the time away from the track worked wonders, as Highest distinction was training better than he had in years. He made his six-year-old debut running a fast-closing second at Turfway Park. He followed up that race with three consecutive triple-digit Equibase speed figures, all in allowance company, finishing fourth at Keeneland, second at Monmouth Park, and winning at Delaware Park on July 14<sup>th</sup>. Trainer Lindsay Schultz has done a wonderful job getting this gelding back into peak form. Highest distinction was foaled and raised at Endeavor Farm and is the second foal out of the stakes-producer Honor Your Gift (by Sightseeing). Her first foal is stakes-winner and Grade 2placed Morning Molly (by Morning Line). Honor Your Gift's third foal is stakes-placed Therearenorules (by Declaration of War). Still yet to race are her three-year-old gelding El Gran Sebas (by Air Force Blue), two-year-old gelding Villain (by Lookin At Lucky), and a 2023 colt by Candy Ride. She is currently in foal to Oscar Performance. Congrats to longtime friend and client John Kuehl on this big homebred win!
