## Added Distance and Switch to Turf Just Right for Homebred Silver N Lai

Silver N Lai put forth a stellar performance on July 23<sup>rd</sup> at Indiana Grand to break his maiden with ease in his third start. After hitting the board in each of his first two starts in dirt sprints, trainer Tom

Amoss gave him an opportunity to stretch out in a two-turn mile on the lawn and the new conditions fit him like a glove. Sitting just behind the leader and pushing the pace for most of the race, Silver N Lai took command at the top of the stretch and was the first to reach the wire under mild urging for a two length margin of victory. The first foal from the Political Force mare Silver Hustler, Silver N Lai was bred by Endeavor Farm in partnership with Silver Hustler Partners. A great trip from jockey Miguel Mena resulted in a big payday for those with wagers

on the gelding as he paid \$19.60 to win! We celebrate this one with co-owners Frank Aubrey, Neil Duncliffe, Steve O'Brien, and Frank Warnock, who campaign this horse in partnership with the farm. With one win already in the bag we can't wait to see where he takes us next!
