Crawdaddy Breaks Maiden First Ask, Wins Stake Next Time Out

A perfect two for two race record starts off the track career of former Endeavor Farm resident Crawdaddy (Girolamo – Rare Edition, by Street Sense). Off at odds of 34-1 (!) in his debut, the dark bay colt broke slowly and saved ground toward the rail on the inside for most of the six furlong turf race. With nowhere to run at the top of the stretch, jockey Luis Saez

swung out 8 wide to find space then angled back inside after finding his stride, blowing by the field to win by 2 ½ lengths in a blazing final time of 1:08.83. Crawdaddy picked up \$43,200 as the victor for his owner, Gold Square LLC. The New York bred three-year-old colt was seen next in the \$100,000 New York Stallion Series Stakes, a seven furlong contest ran over the Widener turf course at Belmont. After a little trouble loading in the gate, Crawdaddy broke in the middle of the pack then settled there until the top of the stretch, finding room on the rail while zipping by his rivals to get up for a three-quarter length victory in 1:22.83. The win was good for another \$60,000, bringing his total career bank roll to \$103,200. Crawdaddy was sold at the 2015 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Preferred New York Bred Yearling sale for \$110,000, consigned by Vinery Sales. He resided at Endeavor as a foal by his dam's side while she was in Kentucky to be bred to Tale of the Cat. Congratulations to Crawdaddy's breeder, Dutchess Views Farm & SGO Thoroughbred LLC. Great job by trainer Jeremiah Englehart to have this young colt in great shape for his debut and subsequent stakes win. We look forward to seeing what else he has in store and wish him and his connections the best of luck.



Isotope Breaks Maiden at Churchill Downs

We couldn't be more thrilled for longtime friends and clients Jim & Mary Durlacher, whose homebred Isotope (pictured above as a foal) broke her maiden at Churchill Downs on Friday, June 23rd. The track was sloppy, but that was no issue for the 3-year-old Successful Appeal filly. She broke alertly and sat just off the pace, then took the lead at the top of the stretch and never looked back, blowing out the field by an impressive 6 ½ lengths. Isotope is out of Anabranche (by Congaree), who the Durlachers also raced. Congratulations on the win and hats off to jockey Jack Gilligan and trainer Tom Amoss.

The bay filly broke her maiden on May 28th, then followed up that victory with an allowance score on June 23rd. Straight Up Smarty was bred in Illinois by her owner and longtime friend and client, Paul Kessel. Shortly after foaling, the bay filly was shipped to Endeavor, where she resided until the time she was sent off to be broke. She went through the sales ring in the 2014 Fasig-Tipton October Yearling Sale, where she was a \$39,000 RNA. The two recent victories bring her total career earnings over the \$44,000 mark.
