Homebred Meadow Blossom breaks maiden first ask for the home team

Another start for farm partner Mark Tsagalakis, another victory! For those of you who may not know, Mark is Terry's partner here at Endeavor and he lives and trains in Southern California. His small, but very successful stable (MT Racing) has been on an absolute tear as of late, winning all 4 of his 4 most recent starts! Those 4 victories include an allowance optional claimer, the Siren Lure Stakes, the Grade III San Simeon Stakes, and his most recent victory in Meadow Blossom's first start, a maiden claimer at Los Alamitos on April 29th. Meadow Blossom was bred by Mark and was foaled and raised right here at Endeavor. The 4-year-old bay filly (Grand Slam – Boston Gold, by Boston Harbor) went off as the 8/5 favorite even though she was the only first time starter in the field of 7. After breaking well and stalking the pace from the rail, Meadow Blossom had to be steadied when she ran into traffic on the far turn. Jockey Agapito Delgadillo was able to find room coming out 3 wide in the stretch and once the filly had a clear lane she powered through gamely to take down the race by half a length in a final time of 1:04.34.

Mark does such a good job of always having his horses ready to run when they go to the starting gate and this was certainly no exception. We love nothing more than to see a horse leave the farm and perform well on the track, but it makes it that much more special when we get to see former residents win one for the home team. Great job Mark, we can't wait to see how this filly does moving forward with her career and we wish everyone connected to this horse the best of luck. Way to go everybody!
